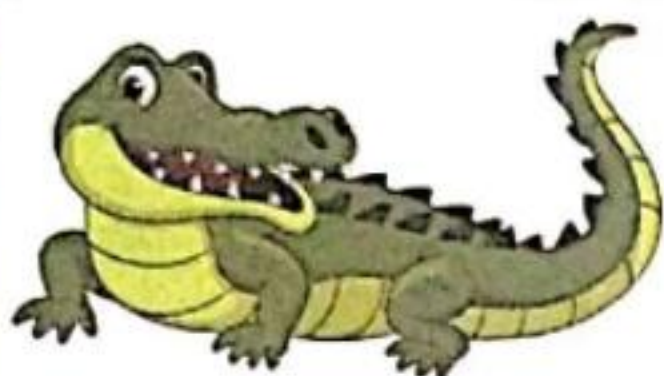

Brain Box

A **compound word** is formed when we combine two words to make a new word, that gets its own special meaning.

Example:
